- Your post should either be in a Word document or in the body of an email and sent to tegan@sasta.asn.au – please include a catchy title for your article.
- Posts must be accompanied by images (at least one).
 - o Please ensure you have permission to share these images on our website, social media and print publications.
 - o Images should be provided as a .jpeg or .png and the higher quality, the better.
 - o Please do not embed photos in a word document, these need to be sent as separate attachments.

- The writing style/tone of our blog is generally casual, yet helpful and friendly, avoid academic jargon. We want you to share your experiences so they can educate, inform, or inspire those reading our blog.
- If you can share a short bio (2-3 sentences) and photo of yourself, we would love to include that as well.
- Ensure all content is properly cited (if needed) and does not violate any existing copyright.
- And don't forget to review your article to check the spelling and grammar before you send it through.
